East Dorset Houses Driving Tour Coordinates:

- 1. Wilson Hotel built in 1852, by Ira Cochrain
- 2. Union Society Church so all faiths could have a place for prayer
- 3. Ira Cochrain's home twin to his brother John's, on Village St eaves-front Greek Revival.
- 4. ¾ Cape Cod house from c1840 used to be on side of the road, was moved back 50 years ago.
- 5. D.G. Williams home for 30 years bought by his neighbor, Joseph Sexton in 1862: Greek Revival.
- 6. Joseph Sexton's Greek Revival home from 1835 to 1862; mirror-image to the Williams' home.
- 7. a. J. Benson house, no longer there. Also Greek Revival style.
- 7 b. J. Gerisch house, Greek Revival style, was part of the Sexton farm by 1880 350 acres all total.
- 8. Caleb Buffam home, also former Town Poor Farm; eaves-front Greek Revival.
- 9. Wheeler Walker Lumber Yard, now completely disappeared from this corner: Wheelerville.
- 10. Schoolhouse #9 in barren landscape- barren due to sheep and lumbermen.
- 11. Rogers Bowen early farmstead. The house is no more, but the granary, barn and milkhouse are there.
- 12. Later Bowen farmstead. Bowen wrote under the pen name "Si Clone".
- 13. "Dorset House", c1850, used to be here, moved in 1950s to the new Shelburne Museum.
- 14. Schoolhouse #12, now a private residence. Formerly a woolen fabric shop.
- 15. Cook- Luther-Connors house, center-hall colonial, c1795, tourist home in 1950s.
- 16. Beebe Farm same family for 7 generations has owned this house. Rent land across Route 7.
- 17. Dunn-Condon House: home of the inventor of the mop wringer pail.
- 18. "Battenkill Rise" Farm. First Bromley ski area began and aborted here; Frost Well Drilling Co.
- 19. Deming-Viall-Palmer house, oldest house in Dorset, Dr Viall returned to farming.
- 20-29: Pre-Civil War neighborhood of farmers & craftsmen, mostly Greek Revival homes, 1840-1850.
- 23. Furnace for producing cast iron items of all kinds.
- 30: Black Goat Artist: home of Tory/Green Mountain Boy, George Marsh, with adjacent pond.
